HIGHWAYS AND OPEN SPACES UPDATE

DINGLE PROJECT

We've been working with Chester Art College to design the Interpretation Boards, and we will soon be working with our Sign Maker to get these ready for production. The Council will approve the final designs.

The Biodiversity Survey has been completed and The Dingle itself is assessed as being in moderate condition. One recommendation from the Survey to introduce Bird & Bat Boxes, and we are meeting with the Council's Green Space Officer in March to consider this.

There have been reports of Fly Tipping and vandalism within the Dingle. A tree was set on fire with branches strewn across and blocking the Public Footpath. Both the Police and the Council have been informed.

VERGES

As we leave Winter and approach Spring the damage to our verges becomes more visible. We appreciate everyone's efforts to maintain the verges which help make Curzon Park such a pleasant place to live. Where possible please ask visitors, delivery drivers, contractors to treat the verges kindly. We all end up paying for repairs through our Council Tax.

BULB PLANTING

The daffodil bulbs we planted are already making an impressive display. For the first time, we also planted a number of snowdrops, and these can

We want to build on the success of bulb planting year-on-year, and we welcome your suggestions and as to where you would like to see them planted.
